

What is the premium catch up funding?

- The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

Why do schools receive this?

- The catch up premium helps schools to provide additional programmes or support in English and maths, so that pupils can catch up over a short period of time.

How is it spent?

- Academies can choose how to spend the money for the educational benefit of the pupils of the academy
- Schools are accountable for how they spend the money and Ofsted will report on the attainment and progress of pupils who attract the premium during an inspection
 - Individual tuition
 - Small group tuition
 - Extra materials
 - Summer schools
